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The 8 Art Shows You Need to See in NYC This Fall

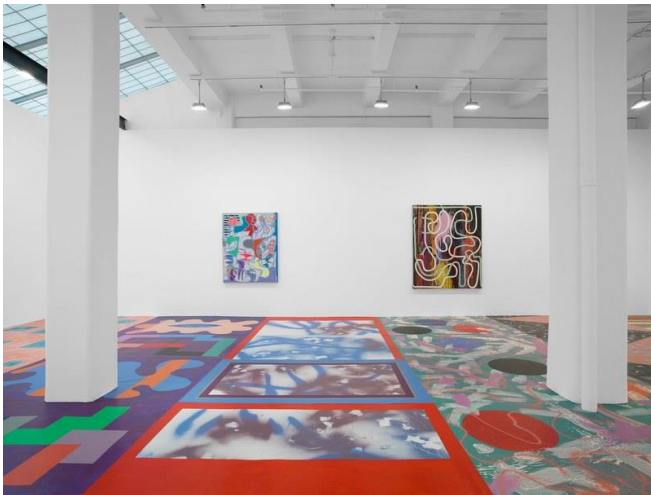
